

CHICKEN-RICE CASSEROLE

FURNISHED BY SHIRLEY SPANGLER

2 cups cubed, cooked chicken breast

½ cups chopped celery

2 tablespoons chopped onion

2 tablespoons chopped green pepper

1/4 cups slivered almonds

3/4 cups mayonnaise

½ cups raw white rice

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 can water

1 can sliced water chestnuts

Mix all ingredients in a 2-quart casserole. Bake, covered, for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour @ 350 degrees. Remove cover and bake until liquid has cooked down, about $\frac{1}{2}$ hour. Cover top of casserole with buttered corn flake crumbs and bake 10 minutes.

To make crumbs, melt 1 or 2 tablespoons butter or margarine in a microwave safe dish. Add 1 cup of crumbs; stir and sprinkle on casserole.

The Shopping Cart for JumpStart was filled to the brim with paper products for the month of November. Jamie got us organized and the Wednesday coffee group made fast work of placing all the items in the bags and ready for delivery on November 16. We are going to collect soup for the month of December. A new grocery list is available at the cart and will be listed in the newsletter as well. Please drop off your purchases in the cart whenever you have them purchased. We will be packing the items for JumpStart on Wednesday, December 13th. Thank you for helping to serve the 120 Head Start families. Your generosity embraces the Matthew 25 ministry. Our December Grocery List includes Bear Creek Soup Mix, Peanut Butter (regular size), Saltines, and Canned Fruit (15 oz).

The Missions Committee applied for a Matthew 25 Grant for monies to assist with our JumpStart project. We are pleased to announce that we have received \$2726 to be used for this endeavor. Thank you Matthew 25 Grant Committee.

Volunteers Wanted; Johnson School has teachers interested in recruiting volunteers for about one hour a week to read to a student or to perhaps have lunch with them. The hours this service is needed vary. One teacher could use help any day 8:10 AM or 10-11 AM. One other could use help 8:30-10 AM, 10:30-11:15 AM, 12:45-2 PM and 2:45-3:15 PM. One more needs help certain days 11:55 AM-12:35 PM. Principal Mrs. McGuire indicates that the "teachers are willing to accommodate the volunteers and are excited to have this opportunity." Loom Project -Sleep Mats: Several people have enjoyed learning about weaving on the looms, how to flatten and fold the bags, how to cut the bags into strips and how to make "twofers or plarn". The Tensions of Christmas

As we move into December, I have a sense that we, as Christians, may feel caught between what seems to be conflicting festivities: 1) a secular, commercial celebration full of material, tangible things appealing to our physical senses, and 2) one of intangible, relational, spiritual values that cherishes relationships and conveys a sense of meaning in life.

While it seems that these two images are in conflict, I think that most of us actually hold them in tension; trying to strike a healthy balance between them. Much of the unhealthy stress and conflict during the Christmas season comes from our expectations and perceptions regarding what we think Christmas should be like rather than what it really is. From the Advent hymn of Charles Wesley:

Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free.

From our fears and sins release us, let us find our rest in thee.

I sense that we really do want Jesus to be present with us, to be released from the fear of the unknown, to be forgiven of our mistakes and faults, and to become healed and whole. We want to rest in the arms of Jesus, loved and accepted for who we really are. Unfortunately, the world looks at the tangible, visible and material things to prove that we are loved and accepted.

This advent I invite you to intentionally look at the events and activities that you do.

- Do they add meaning and joy to the season?
- Is the activity something that is important to you?
- · What happenings, people, and/or events make Christmas meaningful for you?
- What are the essentials of Christmas?

A survey by J. Robinson and J. Staeheli (<u>Unplug the Christmas Machine</u>) discovered that many of us really want our Christmas celebrations to reflect *a relaxed and loving time with family, with reasonable and realistic gifts, and reliable and meaningful family traditions.*

How might you alter your usual activities to reflect a celebration that is more healthful for you and your family? What might you do to counter-act the commercialism that seems to surround us? How might you focus on the intangible and relational aspects of our celebrations? There aren't any easy answers and you may not be able to change anything this year. I encourage you to wrestle with the possibilities and discuss changes with your family for this Christmas and/or for next year.

What has come into being in Him was Life and the Life was the Light of all people.

(John 1:3b-4 RSV)

I invite you to experience Jesus' hope, peace, joy, and love as you find more health-full ways to focus on the spiritual gifts of the season. May you have a blessed and meaningful Christmas as you gaze upon the Christ-child; Immanuel, God with us!
