The New Year---A Time for Reflection

Since January is the first month of the calendar year, many people look at it as a time of beginnings. Traditionally, people may make resolutions for improvements in their life.

But, there can't be beginnings without endings. Sometimes external events or other experiences have impacted or greatly affected our life; a disabling accident or illness, death, divorce, the loss of a job, or an economic downturn. Other experiences may include: an awareness of an inner loss, an opportunity that we ignored, the realization that a longheld hope will never be attained, or the recognition that our self-perception and reality don't match.

The ending of one year and the beginning of next is a chance for reflection; a chance for evaluation and assessment. Are you content with the past year; with what was accomplished or experienced? Was it a year of growth? Do you wish some of your life experiences had been different? Whether the past year has been one of pleasant or unpleasant events and circumstances, you can learn from your experiences and choose to be transformed by them.

"It is not what happens **to** us that matters so much as what happens **in** us. If I want transformation, I must let go of what could have been and pursue what can be."

(A Grace Disguised by G. Sittser)

With this viewpoint I invite you to use the whole month of January as a time of reflection. Each week, take an afternoon or evening to intentionally write down or process with a friend or family member events or experiences from the past year.

- * The endings you have experienced
- What you had hoped to accomplish
- What you actually accomplished
- Unexpected events or experiences
- How you are coping and feeling about the unexpected and/or unrealized
- * The state of my relationships with family, friends or God
- The path of your life without any changes happening
- * Hopes or changes for the next 3 months
- * Actions or things that would help those hopes to happen

Reflect on what you have written or discussed. Place yourself, the past year, and future before God. Ask for healing regarding the losses, the might-have-been's, and the what-if's. We can't change the past, but we can choose to learn from it and let it transform us into a different and better person.

Ask for guidance with the hopes and changes you are considering. Ponder what speaks to your inner self. Let God influence you in choosing one or two that actually seem possible. Put into place specific action steps to accomplish those hopes. Ask for God's presence and strength each day to practice your action steps. May this process of inner reflection help transform you into the creation that God means for you to become.

We shared in a Christmas devotional and the singing of hymns throughout the meeting of "Mary, Did You Know", "Joy to the World", and "Silent Night". Ruth Circle, led by Lorraine Conley, presented a program highlighting the importance of Mary, Joseph, the angels, shepherds, and wise men in the Christmas story with Bonnie Foust sharing a Christmas poem.

Sandy Thomas has expressed concern regarding the amount of time she has available to act as the group's treasurer even though she served us well and is much appreciated. Therefore, it was motioned that Jane Ingledue return to the office of Treasurer. Shurmaine McAlpine and Cyndi O'Hara were nominated to share as Co-Presidents for the coming year.

The new programs for 2024 were passed out with meetings planned for: February 1st, April 4th, June 6th, August 1st, October 3rd, and December 5th.

Our February meeting @ 1:30 pm in the BenTena Room will include installation of officers and Pastor Barrie serving communion. Esther Circle is responsible for treats. At that meeting we will need to make a decision on a fundraiser for 2024. As the year closes, Spencer Grace UWFaith had donations of \$1,716.00 to distribute to worthy causes. In light of our vision of "turning faith, hope and love into action on behalf of women, children, and youth around the world", it was voted to donate \$500.00 to Wings of Refuge in Ames, IA that serves those affected by human trafficking, \$500.00 to the new Discovery House of Spencer assisting those dealing with addictions, \$500.00 to the Camp Scholarship fund for local youth, and \$166.00 going to the diaper tree mission for Birthright.

Remember that all women, not just United Methodists, are welcome as United Women in Faith.

The roof on Fellowship Hall has shown no signs of leaking so far this winter as there were no leaks reported after the last rain. At the present time maintenance of that roof is scheduled to take place in the Spring of 2024. A new electronic sound system was installed in the bell tower just prior to the Christmas holiday. We now have the ability to program music, chimes, and bell ringing, bringing new life to our bell tower once again. Thank you to the group of dedicated individuals who made this dream a reality. The Trustees are grateful for warmer temperatures so far this winter as it has been a great help in keeping our heating budget in check. Thank you to everyone who has also made the effort to turn off lights and turn down thermostats when rooms are vacated. Every effort has helped to control our utility expenses.


The church office will have copies of the book, **Growing Slow**, that you may purchase for \$10. You may choose to buy the accompanying Bible Study workbook, but that is a


personal choice, and it is not necessary to participate in the class.
