#### **The Transition Process Continues**

Grace UMC continues to be in a transition process. I would like to review the progress I have seen, so you can see how far Grace UMC has come. Transitions begin with endings. Grace experienced an ending last March with the vote. Even before the vote, there were endings with changes in operational policies, programs, personnel, and participation by various persons. There have been layers of grief, hurt, and woundedness regarding many of those changes, even back to 2021.

After the experience of endings, there is a move into an "in-between or neutral time" as grief is processed and mourning happens. Alan Wolfelt's process of mourning seems to describe what happens during this in-between time. Grace UMC has realized the death of the past and contemplated the not-yet of the future through the following:

- 1) Acknowledged of the reality of loss: that things will never be the same. Grace UMC's identity, some of our members, and some of our past activities are gone from its present reality.
- 2) Embraced and/or befriended the loss: Grace UMC has worked to understand that its hurt and woundedness has needed healing. The woundedness hasn't been forgotten. The Holy Spirit has been called upon to surround Grace UMC with Christ's healing love and light, so that the pain can be transformed.
- 3) Remembering and honoring the loss: Grace UMC is moving woundedness from presence to memory. Just as Grace UMC has remembered the situations it went through and survived in its early years, it now does with the recent situation. What was is now in the past.

The woundedness and hurt is remembered and honored as Grace UMC moves through the pain into healing.

Last fall and winter, Grace UMC experienced a shift within the transition process. People started thinking less about the past and more about the future. Possibilities were explored and work began towards the future by:

4) Developing a new self-identity: Grace UMC began working on what it is becoming. This has become a time for experimentation as questions are asked, new things tried, and different avenues for ministry are searched out within our congregation and the Spencer community.

These have included: the development of "Growing in Grace" logo, identifying our core values, formulating a new vision and mission statement, and creating a covenant for our Ad Council. We have experimented with monthly Dinner Church, Wednesday night programming and/or educational opportunities, a variety of music ministries, and the re-configuration of administrative policies and the functioning of committees.

5) Searching for meaning: Grace UMC has had significance within the lives of many persons in its congregation and within the Spencer community. There is now an opportunity to create a variety of meaningful and different connections in both places.

Grace UMC re-discovered its passion for mission: making sleeping mats, working with Head Start on food bags and winter-wear, filling the Heifer Project Ark and providing books to Spencer's 2nd graders. Vibrant worship, supportive fellowship and intercessory prayer are being experienced throughout our church community.

6) Receiving and offering on-going support: As Grace UMC continues to build a different congregational life, it is giving and receiving support from each other, community organizations, friends, neighbors, and other congregations in and around Spencer.

There is the continuation of Coffee at Grace, study groups, monthly Dinner Church, being visible in the community through the Downtown Market, Flagfest, and community/church Bridge Events. Grace UMC is participating with other churches through the Lenten Lunch and Service series, has opened its facilities to community groups, and is inviting others to participate in Grace UMC activities. Grace UMC is connecting within and beyond its church family.

This transition process will continue as Grace UMC lives into its new beginning by welcoming Pastor Michael and his family. Grace UMC will continue to explore and experiment with different ministries, will build caring community within and outside its walls, and be the presence of Christ in Spencer, IA. May God's glory continue to shine through and among the people of Grace UMC!



#### **Angel Food Cake**

#### Recipe by Shirley Spangler

#### Ingredients:

12 L. egg whites, room temp 1 c. sugar

1 1/2 tsp. cream of tartar 1 c. cake flour

1 1/2 tsp. vanilla 1 c. powdered sugar

Place egg whites, cream of tartar, and vanilla in a large metal bowl. Beat on high speed until soft peaks form. Continue beating and add granulated sugar until stiff peaks form. Sift cake flour and powdered sugar mixture, fold in until there are no lumps left in batter. Pour into a 9 x 13 ungreased pan and bake for 25 minutes at 350 degrees, or until top is a light golden brown. Remove from oven and invert upside-down until cool. Remove from pan and frost.

HINT: How to place the pan upside-down; prior to using the pan, place 4 coffee cups on counter and put each corner on cake pan. Make sure pan is upside-down so you can have an accurate measurement. This will allow for cake to cool and will not sink in the middle. If cake does sink, then it was either baked too long, or not long enough. Also, a raised cooling rack and its big enough for the pan, it may be used.
