## TRUSTEE REPORT

The Trustees met recently and provided this update on the flood recovery.

1. The electrical and heating systems are 98% completed throughout the church with the exception of minor things which will be addressed as they surface.
2. The air conditioning will be completed in the spring when warmer temperatures arrive.
3. The elevator agreement was signed in December with the Schumaker Elevator Company. Tentative schedule for work on the elevator will begin sometime in April. It is expected that repairs will take three weeks.
4. The Trustees have contacted Carey's Electronics in regard to the bell tower project. They have been here to assess the situation and have submitted an estimate for replacing the damaged parts. We are expecting them to be here soon to replace all the electronic components located in our lower level. Then our bell tower speakers can be returned to service and we can once again share music with our friends and neighbors.

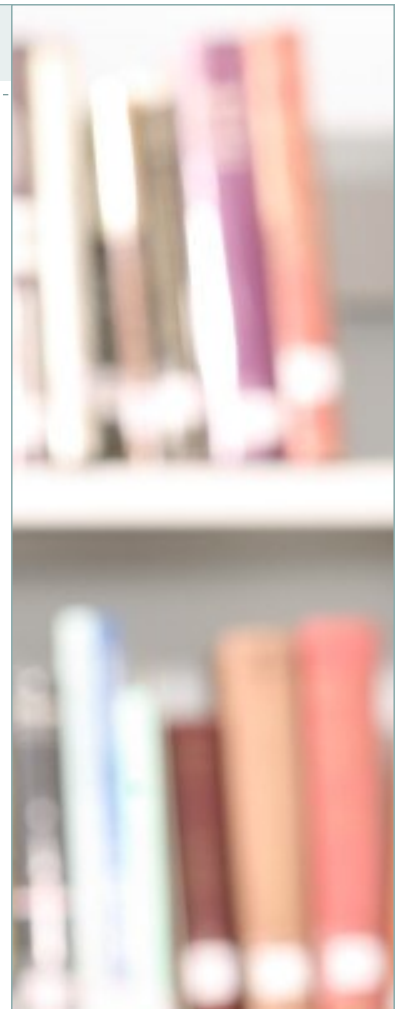
Future projects for the church were also discussed.

1. Clean up and replace carpet where needed on two of the stairways that were impacted by flood water.
2. Rebuild the shower rooms by replacing doors and installing new sheetrock in the lower level where it was impacted by the flood.
3. Assist with removing all of the electrical boxes and disconnected electrical equipment from the lower level. (This will be a scheduled event. Items will be recycled )

FYI. The Spencer Archery Team has set up an archery range in the dirt room under the sanctuary. Various ages of young people meet for practice under adult supervision several times a week. Ask for a tour to better appreciate what they are doing.

Finally, the Trustees would like to extend heartfelt thanks to all of the church and community volunteers who helped us on our road to recovery at Grace United Methodist Church. Your help has been greatly appreciated.

## THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR MICHAEL

The word authority brings up a wellspring of emotional responses. I would venture to guess, most of us have had positive and negative experiences with authority. Whether in ministry, or in my short stint in manufacturing, I have seen examples of authority tearing people down and building teams up. The impact of authority has a strong correlation with the relationship developed between the people involved.

*“But Jesus called them over and said, “You know that those who rule the Gentiles show off their authority over them and their high-ranking officials order them around. But that’s not the way it will be with you. Whoever wants to be great among you will be your servant.” -Matthew 26:24-26*

Authority is an important piece to the decision-making process within any organized body. Without clear guidance and hierarchy committees, institutions, or organizations, focus on big ideas without putting the actions plans to get things done. The work of the Church brings a unique dynamic that it is not just about getting the work done. The character and culture is developed through the approach and relationships of those in authority to their subordinates. Jesus is the Head of the Church. In that position, Jesus leads with grace, mercy, compassion, and love. Jesus still shares accountability, encouraging us to learn, develop, and grow. Jesus does so by coming along side us in the process.

As I continue to lead as pastor at Grace UMC, I hope to encourage this same type of leadership in my words and actions. I want to foster a culture within our leadership team, and larger church body, that we come along side one another as

we develop our skills to serve the church, our gifts to serve God, and our relational growth with one another. Our main task is making room for people to experience the love of Jesus and that begins with our love of those people. No better way to practice loving people than by beginning with those with whom we serve and worship. There are many tasks I could take on myself. This would save myself time and energy. This is a disservice to the Church. God never brings us whole people. Pulling people into the work, and walking along side them as they make mistakes, learn, and grow, is not only a development of good culture it is the calling of Jesus upon us as disciples and the leadership style he revealed in his life, death, and resurrection.

In the month of February, I encourage you to be intentional with your love of the people within our congregation and leadership team. As Jesus said “treat everyone as you want to be treated”. I will paraphrase “love others the way you need and want to be loved.” As a person in authority at Grace UMC, I plan to join you in this endeavor to help each person grow in our love and service to each other. If you have a task connected to church work invite someone to join you in it. This is a great opportunity to give everyone opportunities to serve, learn, love, and grow. This is one way we can “Grow in Grace.” I believe we will discover that growing in grace will lead us to more and more opportunities to serve others. Through this work I believe this will also lead more and more individuals to want to serve with us.

### SLEEPING MATS

Our completed sleep mat numbers continue to grow as dedicated workers weave on Wednesday afternoons. At last count we had 67 sleep mats completed. That's 46,900 plastic bags that did not go to landfills. ### HEIFER PROJECT

Our Heifer Project challenge of meeting a \$500.00 Foundation Grant was met in January. In addition Spencer Women Of Faith also donated \$500.00 as well. The money will go to purchase animals for families in foreign countries to help them raise money for food and as household income.

### READING BOOKS

The Missions Committee is looking forward to giving out books to graduating 2nd graders again this spring. It is the hope that by reading through the summer the children will be better ready to start the school year in the fall. This year we would like to include second graders in Sacred Heart School, Iowa Great Lakes Lutheran School and two Home-schooled students for a total of 180 students within Spencer. ## FINANCE

Our 2024 calendar year budget expense was \$281,337.51. We had income of \$283,752.19 and ended the year in the black.

There are budget concerns for 2025; however, the Finance Committee has reduced expenses to optimize our budget projections for 2025. We have a budget of \$312,000.00. There are pledges of \$139,000.00 for the 2025 budget year. There are still additional pledges to be received.

We are thankful for those who give using Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) or “bill-pay” options. As we move through the year most of our expenses remain the same but offerings can fluctuate pretty dramatically. The EFTs are regular throughout the seasons of the year. That really reduces the stress for the leadership’s work and decision-making.

If that doesn’t work for you there is always the “in person” giving during the Sunday morning service; there is even an icon in the Sunday service bulletin that you can scan to make your offering; or just mail it to the church office. We are immensely grateful for all you do to support our church.

### ESSEINTRICS

Essentrics is a new class at church led by Bernie Beecher. It is held on Monday and Wednesday from 9:30AM to 10:00AM. Essentrics training is a type of strength training that involves using the target muscles to control weight as it moves in a downward motion. This type of training can help build muscle, improve athletic performance, and reduce the risk of injury. An eccentric contraction is the motion of an active muscle while it is lengthening under load. Essentrics training is repetitively doing eccentric muscle contractions. For example, in a biceps curl the action of lowering the dumbbell back down from the lift is the eccentric phase of that exercise – as long as the dumbbell is lowered slowly rather than letting

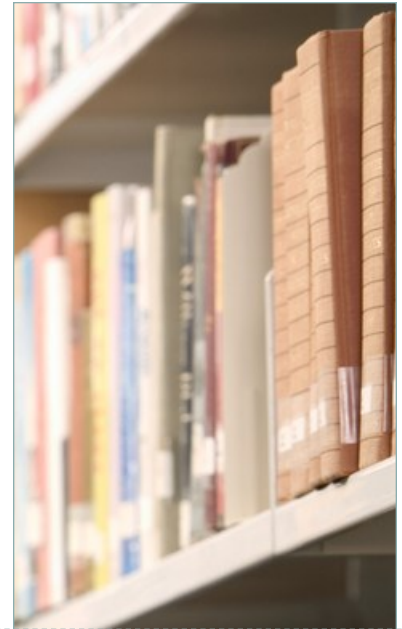

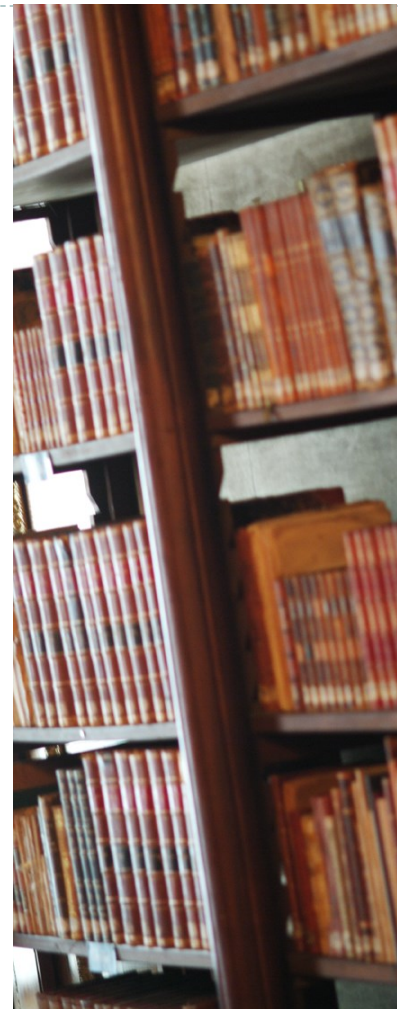
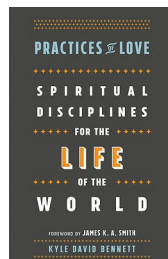
## TUESDAY MORNING STUDY

neighbor as ourselves...and may we find ourselves in Christ as we love our neighbor.





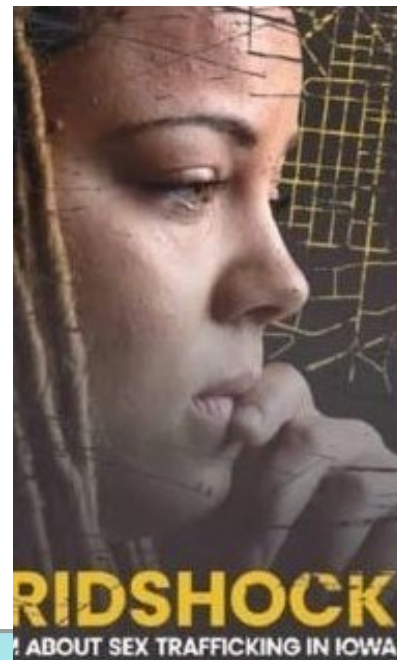

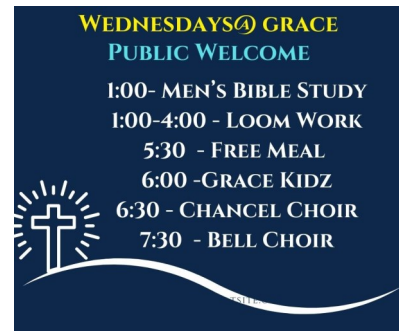
